


# **DCFS Fundraiser Survey 2018-2019**


## 29 respondents


What was your favourite fundraiser?






What was your LEAST favourite fundraiser, and why?


What do you feel is the best price point for a product based fundraiser, specifically for the lowest priced product that could be purchased?






How much per year do you usually plan to spend on school fundraisers?


What is the most important factor to you in deciding on whether you will participate in a fundraiser?






If you volunteered to assist with a fundraiser this year - THANK YOU! If not, what were the main reasons you were unable to assist?
